

THE SAICA 2026 BUSINESS RESCUE PRACTITIONER (BRP) ANNUAL DECLARATION AND MONITORING PROCESS

1. The 2026 Business Rescue Practitioner annual declaration process for the 2026 cycle will commence in **October/ November 2026**, and the monitoring process will commence in **January 2027**. Business Rescue Practitioners are required to complete and submit their annual declaration by **15 January 2027**. Please note that immediately after the declaration submission deadline date, SAICA will select Business Rescue Practitioner members for the 2026 monitoring process. If selected, BRPs will be required to provide supporting evidence confirming their compliance with the BRP Continuing Professional Development (CPD) requirements.
2. SAICA will be required to report to the Companies and Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC) on the outcome of these processes by **31 March 2027**.

Proposed timelines for 2026 and 2027:

4. The proposed timelines for the 2026 Business Rescue Practitioner annual declaration and monitoring process are as follows:

Note: The dates provided below are planned dates and may be subject to change. Should any changes be necessary, SAICA will communicate the revised dates accordingly. Members and Associates are reminded that it remains their responsibility to review all communication issued by SAICA for any change of dates and to contact the SAICA Member Compliance team should they require any clarification regarding any dates, requirements, or processes.

August 2026: Update of personal details and CPD requirements

5. Business Rescue Practitioners must ensure that the personal details on their SAICA profiles are up to date. It is imperative that the personal details are up to date as this ensures that members receive all important notices from SAICA (this may be updated via the SAICA [Member Portal](#)).



6. BRPs need to ensure that they fully understand their business-rescue-specific CPD obligations and are on track to comply on or before **31 December 2026**. Please note that there will be **no extensions** granted to comply with these requirements. If your business-rescue-specific CPD hours are insufficient, please implement immediate interventions to ensure compliance on or before **31 December 2026**.
7. Business Rescue Practitioners must attain a minimum of **20 hours** of the relevant professional development activities each calendar year, of which –
 - A minimum of 12 (of the above 20 hours) hours must be verifiable, of which 4 hours must be directly related to business rescue
 - A minimum of 8 hours of learning (verifiable /non-verifiable) must be completed each year.

Please note that four (4) of the 12 verifiable hours must be directly related to business rescue, and the other eight hours can be CPD related to the concept/process of business rescue, such as accounting, taxation, management accounting, human resources, management and related labour and other legislation.

8. For the 2026 calendar year, the CPD must be attained between **1 January 2026 and 31 December 2026**. A member who registered as a BRP during the year 2026 may apportion the CPD based on the number of months in 2026 in respect of which he/she was registered as such. Business Rescue Practitioners must maintain detailed records of their CPD – for example, in the PDF, docx, images, ppt, zip or Excel format.
9. Business Rescue Practitioners must retain their CPD records for a period of 5 years.

Exemption requirements

10. In terms of the [CIPC Business Rescue CPD Policy](#), registered Business Rescue Practitioners may apply for exemption from the CPD requirements **only under exceptional circumstances**.
11. To be considered for exemption, please take note of the following conditions:
 - You must not be professionally active. This means that you must not perform any work related to business rescue, whether paid or unpaid, during the exemption period;
 - The exemption must relate to an extended period of inactivity (Short-term breaks or temporary leave do not qualify);

- Exemption applications are assessed on a case-by-case basis.

12. If you meet the above criteria, you may submit a formal application for exemption through the SAICA [Member Portal](#), with supporting information detailing your circumstances and confirming that you will not be professionally active during the period in question. Please note:

- Once the exemption has been granted, this will remain in place until the circumstances for which the exemption was granted are no longer applicable. The onus is on the member to inform SAICA when the circumstances around the granting of the exemption are no longer applicable.

More information on verifiable CPD

13. The concept of verifiability is that the learning activity can be objectively verified (i.e. by someone with no direct or vested interest in the learning activity) by a competent source (i.e. someone who can provide a true and fair representation that the learning activity has taken place). 14. Please take note of the following when SAICA events or when reading articles:

14.1. Delegates who book and attend live SAICA webcasts or face-to-face events will automatically receive a confirmation of attendance email confirming the registered delegate attended, the stated webcast / event and the duration of the webcast / event;

14.2. If you are unable to attend the live event, then you can watch the recording on the SAICA eVolve platform. – In this case you must complete the assessment and submit this as evidence. Where you are watching a recording of a past event and not a live event or you have read a SAICA CPD article, no certificate of attendance will be issued, and you will have to obtain the completion certificate to serve as verifiable CPD. To obtain a completion certificate, you need to successfully complete the relevant assessment and attain a pass mark of 75% on the SAICA eVolve platform, after having watched the entire recording of the relevant session. You can then download the completion certificate on the SAICA eVolve system;

14.3. If you read an [Integritax article](#), the assessment must be done on eVolve and the confirmation of completion certificate must be downloaded as verifiable CPD confirmation. The pass mark needed to obtain the certificate is 75%;

- 14.4. The learning and assessments must have taken place in the period under review (1 January – 31 December annually) – the reports must therefore reflect that this was completed during the relevant period. Please review your dashboard to confirm that all your quizzes were completed on or before 31 December 2025;

October/ November 2026: Business Rescue Annual Declaration Deadline

PLEASE TAKE CAREFUL NOTE OF THE CHANGE IN DECLARATION AND MONITORING PROCESS FOR THE 2026 REPORTING CYCLE

20. SAICA will send a notice with a request to complete and submit the Business Rescue Practitioner annual declaration. The due date for the submission of the declaration will be **15 January 2027**. The declaration will be accessible on the SAICA [Member Portal](#).
21. **ALL** Business Rescue Practitioner members are required to submit both their annual Business Rescue Practitioner declaration together with **ALL** verifiable CPD hours for Business Rescue Practitioners. This is due to the challenges and delays experienced in prior years in obtaining this CPD evidence from members who were selected for monitoring.
22. Once the declaration is available, the steps on how to submit the Business Rescue Practitioner annual declaration and to upload the evidence on the member portal will be communicated.

18 January 2027: Business Rescue Practitioner Compliance Monitoring Requirements and Deadline

23. A monitoring notice will be issued to Business Rescue Practitioners selected for monitoring. Verifiable CPD will be requested if insufficient evidence was provided or not provided due to the non-submission of a declaration. The due date for uploading supporting evidence will be **Friday, 5 February 2027**.

24. The steps on how to submit/upload the required evidence on the SAICA Member Portal will be communicated. Please note that you will not be able to upload evidence after the due date of **Friday, 5 February 2027** has passed.

February/March 2027: Business Rescue Practitioner Annual Declaration and Monitoring Verification

25. SAICA will be processing the responses submitted by Business Rescue Practitioners and reviewing the monitoring evidence submitted/uploaded by individual members to verify compliance or address documentary challenges and preparing the Accredited Professional Body Compliance report for submission to CIPC.

31 March 2027: Reporting

26. SAICA will submit the Accredited Professional Body Compliance report to the CIPC.
